Old Business

Forestry Report

The Spring Survey and associated pruning have been completed

Forest survey/pruning in East Zone is in progress

- East Zone – Vassar to Midland
- Mid Zone – Midland to Purdue
- West Zone – Purdue to Vanderbilt

This survey and pruning project with Droege Tree Care will run for 2 years

What will be accomplished

- Winter – Oak Tree pruning
- Spring – Maintenance (dead limbs, raising the canopy to a minimum of 15 ft above the sidewalks)
- Pruning will start in August

Re-planting

- Sapling trees will be ordered in the fall and planted in the spring
- Droege Tree Care will select trees whose roots grow vertically into the ground, rather than horizontally, so as not to further damage sidewalks
- The tree species will vary to prevent spread of tree diseases

Streets, Sidewalks, Curbs, Gutters, Potholes

- Potholes were filled the week of July 11th in the subdivision

- Experts are assessing the subdivision roadways and will provide a cost for laying down a protective asphalt sealant that will extend the life of the roadways
- Roadway “Stop” signs and “Dead End Street” signs will be ordered as needed

- We have asked the city if we can hang banner announcements about street sweeping in Mooney Park and on the Delmar Island at Midland

University City is Providing Flood Relief to Residents

JULY 28, 2022, University City, Mo – The Mayor and City Council for the City of University City have authorized the City Manager to conduct an extra bulky item collection to assist residents whose homes experienced damage in the historic July 26 flood.

Beginning Monday, August 1, 2022, City staff will start bulky item collection in the East Area and residents are requested to please place bulky items next to the curb. Dumpsters for the collection of bulky items will be placed in neighborhoods and private subdivisions that were severely impacted by flooding. University City’s established guidelines still apply for the types of items that qualify for pickup.

“We understand the stress that families in our community are experiencing, which has been compounded by the excessive rain. That’s why we wanted to take some immediate steps to offer relief to victims of this historic flood as we continue the process of gathering more facts and information,” said Mayor Terry Crow.

Effective immediately, in addition to the collection of bulky items, the Mayor and Council have authorized the City Manager to waive right-of-way permit fees and building permit fees for owner-occupied single-family residences for the next 90 days. This will apply to the placement of private dumpsters on City-maintained streets. In addition, the Police Department will be providing extra patrols in those areas where residents were forced to vacate their homes due to flooding.

Residents whose homes have flood damage and need assistance are advised to call 211, a 24/7 connection operated by The United Way of Greater St. Louis that connects people to services that can help, including a list of organizations to contact to receive assistance. “I believe the actions taken by the Mayor and Council will provide some relief and serve as a buffer to our residents who experienced damage from the flood as we develop more long-term strategies for cleaning up our City and returning to normal operations,” said City Manager, Gregory Rose. "We sincerely appreciate everyone's concern and cooperation during this time.”
